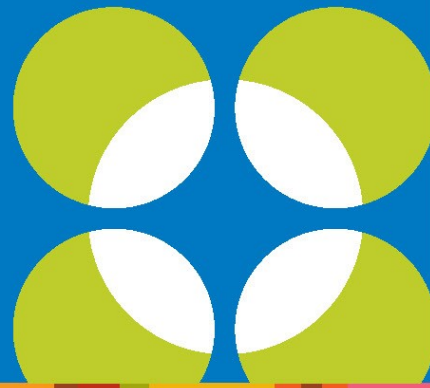

Almost three years ago, 22-year-old **Anthony Daniels**, a talented & hard-working college athlete, was diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma. Since that day, December 22, 2011, Anthony has continued his studies at Fordham University's Gabelli School of Business while undergoing cancer treatments at Memorial Sloan Kettering in New York City. Anthony needs an allogeneic transplant which means that an outside donation of white blood cells is essential for his recovery. What makes this search more difficult is that Anthony's donor match will be rare because of his DNA markers. Due to the rareness of Anthony's white blood cells, increasing the sample size of potential donors is critical. Registration for anyone age 18-44 is free, painless and easy – a simple swab is taken of the inner cheek. Every day, thousands of adults and children like Anthony are diagnosed with lymphoma, aplastic anemia, leukemia, sickle cell anemia and other serious diseases that require stem cell transplants as a cure. Like Anthony, 70 percent of those patients will not find matches within their own families and must turn to the national registry to find a donor match as their cure.
